

GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS SUBMITTING PAPER FOR 13th INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON GRAPHIC ENGINEERING AND DESIGN – GRID26

When preparing the paper for submission, authors should keep to the following guidelines:

1. The manuscript

You are asked to submit your paper as an MS Word document (.docx).

The text should be written using a Calibri Light 10pt font, single spaced, justified.

All the pictures and diagrams must be embedded (300 ppi).

Formatting requirements are:

Paper size: A4 (210 x 297 mm)

Margins (mirror margins): TOP = 2,5 cm BOTTOM = 2,5 cm INSIDE/OUTSIDE = 3 cm

Keep up with the following template:

Title: Calibri Bold, 14pt, Uppercase, centred

Authors: First name, last name, institute/organization, Calibri, 11 pt, Italic, centred

Abstract: Calibri Light Italic, 10pt, justified

Keywords: Calibri Light Regular, 10pt, left alignment

Sections: Calibri, 12pt, Uppercase, space before and space after 12pt, left alignment

Subsections: Calibri, Bold, 10pt, space before 12pt, space after 6pt, left alignment. Titles and subtitles should be numbered

Text: Calibri Light 10 pt, single spaced, justified

Language: English only

2. Illustrations, figures, tables, equations

Figures/drawings must be integrated into text and also SENT SEPARATELY (300 PPI).

Number all figures and tables and refer to them in the text as Figure 4 or Table 1.

Examples:




Figure 1: Simulation results

Figure and Table titles in Calibri Light Italic, 9 pt, should be placed centred below Figures and align left above Tables. Text in Tables should be in Calibri Light, 9 pt

Number all your equations, as following (use either the Microsoft Equation Editor: Insert > Objects > Create New > Microsoft Equation > or MathType Equation):

$$J \frac{d\omega(t)}{dt} + F\omega(t) = T_e(t) - T_o(t). \quad (1)$$

3. Literature references

References in the text should be indicated by the authors name and year (Surname, 1996); (Surname_1 & Surname_2, 2000); (Surname_1, Surname_2 & Surname_3); (Surname_1 et al, 2010). The list of sources referred to in the text should be collected at the end of the paper in alphabetical order. The information should be given in the following order:

<Name of Standard Body/Institution>. (<Year of publication>) <Standard number>. <Title>. <Place of publication>, <Publisher>¹

<Surname_1>, <N_1>, <Surname_2>, <N_2>. & <Surname_3>, <N_3>. (<Year of publication>) <Title of journal article>. <Title of journal>. <Volume number> (<Issue number>), <Page numbers of the article> (do not use 'p.' or 'pp.' before the page numbers). Available from: doi: <doi number>²

<Author/Editor/CorporateAuthor>. (<Year of publication, or n.d. if the year is not available>) <Title>. Available from: <URL> [Accessed <Date of access>]³

<Surname>, <N>. (<Year of publication>) <Title>. <Type of thesis>. <Academic institution>⁴

<Chapter author surname>, <N>. (<Year of publication>) <Title of chapter>. In: <Editor surname>, <N>. (ed.) <Book Title>. <Place of publication>, <Publisher>, <Page numbers> (use 'p.' before a single page number and 'pp.' where there are multiple pages)⁵

<Surname>, <N>. (<Year of publication>) <Title>. <Place of publication>, <Publisher>⁶

<Surname>, <N>. (<Year of publication>) <Title>. <Name of patent organisation> <Patent number> (Patent)⁷

<Surname>, <N>. (<Year of publication>) <Title of conference paper>. In: <Editor surname>, <N>. (ed.) <Title of conference proceedings>, <Conference dates>, <Conference place>. <Place of publication>, <Publisher>. <page numbers> (use 'p.' before a single page number and 'pp.' where there are multiple pages)⁸
